Our normal duties include various aspects of updating and maintaining the website that is the backbone to our information transmission to members, volunteers, and board members that fulfill our purpose. In addition to the physical website, typical tasks include: maintaining the site content, verifying merchant & email accounts, updating pictures on the site to stay up-to-date and relevant, verify site "uptime", adding and deleting files as needed, add blog posting as committees submit them, along with newsletter submissions.

The time commitment varies throughout the year, with the majority of the time needed in the fall & winter to verify any major updates for the following year.
