The purpose of the Networking Committee is to provide a conduit for our members to interact with other members.

Our normal duties are to address code compliance issues on the local, county and state level. These issues may be very broad or very specific in nature. The one thing they will have in common is it will inhibit our members from doing business effectively.

The makeup of the committee is to be one architect or P.E, two commercial builders, two residential builders, two commercial service techs, two residential service techs, one distributor and one manufacturer. The makeup of the committee may change from time to time as deemed necessary by the committee chairperson.

The time commitment will vary throughout the year and as issues present themselves. Once a network of code officials and government officials are established, issues should require less time to resolve. The chair person serves to coordinate committee efforts, organize and preside over meetings. The chair person will also create monthly reports to the board of directors and be prepared to answer questions from members regarding government issues. This position requires an additional 1-2 hours per month as issues arise.

Benefits of serving on this committee includes exposure with local officials as well as Congressman and Senators. You may be working directly with these representatives making valuable contacts and presenting yourself and APSP as experts in the industry.
